The Shang dynasty is founded when Cheng Tang overthrows the Xia dynasty. He has the support of 40 other kingdoms. Her tomb is the only intact Shang tomb that has been found to date	The last Shang king, Di Xin, begins his reign.	Slaves revolt in protest against cruel treatment and increasing taxes. The Shang dynasty is overthrown and re- placed by the Zhou dynasty.

Key Vocabulary

Civilisation	a society that has a high level of culture and social organisation
Ancestors	somebody from whom somebody else is directly descended, especially more distant than a grandparent
Society	a structured community of people bound to- gether by similar traditions, institutions, or nationality
Empire	a group of nations, territories, or peoples ruled by an emperor or empress
Dynasty	a succession of rulers from the same family
Emperor	a man who rules an empire
Inscriptions	a sequence of words or letters written, printed, or engraved on a surface



- The Shang were frequently mentioned in many Chinese myths, legends and fables, but no one really knew whether they had ever really existed in the past.
- Ancient inscriptions discovered to have been carved into bones nearly 3,000 years previously, during a time in China known as the Shang Dynasty—this was finally evidence they existed.
- King Cheng Tang was the first Shang king and King Di Xin was the last. They ruled nearly 500 years apart.
