Vomiting and Diarrhoea —School policy and NHS Guidance

We have recently had a few cases where parents have queried our policy for staff and children to have to be off-site for a full 48 hours following a bout of vomiting or diarrhoea.

This guidance comes from the NHS (<u>https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/diarrhoea-and-vomiting/#:~:text=can%20spread%20easily-</u>,<u>important,for%20at%20least%202%20days.</u>)

As a school we are bound to follow this guidance in order to keep children and staff safe. I understand how vomiting can be caused by something other than a spreadable virus. Sometimes breathing difficulty, eating too quickly, over excitement, heat etc can cause little people to vomit. However, as we are not doctors, we simply must follow this guidance. We have no way of proving or disproving a reason for vomiting.

This counts for both staff and children. We have had to face the struggle of covering staff members because of this rule before and it is not without its difficulty and frustration on our part. Naturally, we want all children in school but the school would be seen as being derelict in its duty and open to being in all kinds of legal trouble if we knowingly let people back into the building soon after vomiting.

I understand that this can cause frustration. As a working parent, I know how hard last minute childcare can be to organise and how this rule can cause parents/grandparents to have to take days off work.

It is simply the NHS guidance that we must follow. I have confirmed this with the Learning Authority and they have told me that there is no is no wiggle room on this whatsoever. Therefore, it must remain the rule.

If a child or adult who attends or works at the school has a case of vomiting and/or diarrhoea, they will not be permitted to return until 48 hours has passed since their last episode.
