Monday

Let's Play: Cushion steppingstones

Skills your child will develop:

- Counting skills
- Numeral recognition
- Turn taking

Activity:

Lay some cushions on the floor (or bits of paper if you would rather not use cushions) and label them from 1-6. Roll a dice (you can download an app if you don't have a physical dice) and support your child to recognise what number it landed on. Then ask them to hop, walk or jump along that number of cushions.



Challenge further:

Use larger numbers for an extra challenge and start at 10. Have races with a teddy, who can cross the cushion stones first?

Tuesday

Let's Play: Rainbow writing

Skills your child will develop:

- Fine motor skills
- Letter formation

Find as many different coloured pencils as you have and try writing your name in the style of a rainbow like below:



Challenge further:

Try writing other people names in your family or your friends.

Wednesday

Let's Play: Junk box modelling

Skills your child will develop:

- Creativity and designing
- Fine motor skills
- Different uses of objects

Activity:

Gather a variety of recycling boxes, tubes, lids etc and give them a good wash. Provide tape, glue scissors, pens and pencils and get creative. Follow your child's lead and support them in bringing their ideas to life. Use a lot of open-ended questions such as "what will happen if?", "why have you chosen to do it like that?".



Challenge further:

Put together some instructions for a friend, brother or sister so they could have a go at making it too.

Thursday

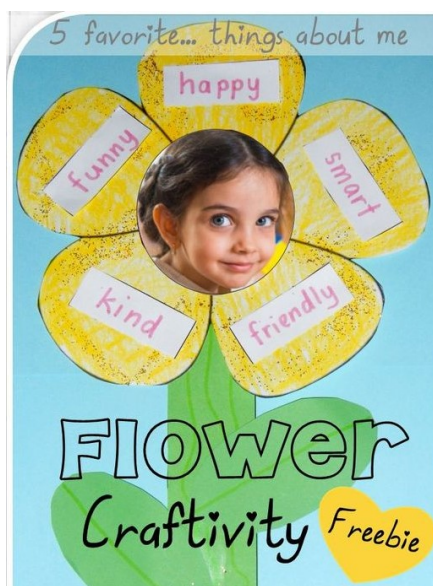
Let's Play: All about me flower

Skills your child will develop:

- Self confidence
- Reflection
- Positive self-image

Activity:

Draw a flower and give it 4-5 petals. Encourage your child to colour or decorate the flower however they wish. Then support them to think of 4-5 things about themselves to add to the flower, these could be things such as talents e.g. 'I'm great at dancing' or aspects of their personality, 'I am kind', 'I am funny'.



Challenge further:

Make an 'all about me' flower for your whole family and gift them to each other.

Friday

Let's Play: Paper chains

Skills your child will develop:

- Fine motor skills

Activity:

Using some coloured paper (or plain paper you have decorated) draw some straight lines for your child to cut along to make strips. Find some glue, tape or a stapler and work together to loop and link your strips of paper into a paper chain.



Challenge further:

How long can you make your paper chain? Count how many links you have!
